MO-ARK District Delegates at Large Meeting







The Missouri Arkansas District held their annual meeting in Springfield, MO on August 1, 2020 at the University Plaza Hotel. It was definitely an annual meeting of a different sort. Since the Coronavirus Pandemic changed the rules of meeting, the District Board decided to meet in-person but allow members to join by Zoom.

Members include the current District Officers, Trustees, Lt. Governors, and Past Governors. A total of 59 people constituted the Delegates at Large. We had 29 delegates which made the quorum for the meeting.

The Delegates elected AC Paxton as the next Governor and Carla O'Brien as the next Governor-Elect. Both were elected with a motion and approved by the delegate body.

The District presented two (2) sets of by-law changes for approval.

- 1. The Missouri Arkansas District By-Laws required an update of the terms of office for the Trustees and Lt. Governors to match the wording in the Kiwanis International bylaws.
 - Article III, Section 3 of the by-laws relating to Officers was changed to read that each Lieutenant Governor shall serve for a term of two-years and each Trustee shall serve for a term of three (3) years. No Governor or Governor-Elect shall be elected to more than one (1) consecutive term in the same office. All other officers shall serve a term of one (1) year, unless otherwise specified.
 - This allows a Lt. Governor or Trustee to serve additional terms, if necessary. Hopefully, we will always have individuals that step up to serve. However, this will insure that each division and region are represented.
- 2. The Earl Collins Foundation Board felt the need to make various changes in their by-laws. There were several changes made to make clarifications and update processes. The biggest change made was to make the Earl Collins fiscal year match the fiscal year of the District, October 1 September 30th.
 - The second change was to make it clear that any future changes to the by-laws must be made by the House of Delegates. All changes can be found at www.moarkkiwanis.net.

Both items passed by a motion and approved by the delegate body.

There were also two (2) resolutions for approval.

- 1. A resolution endorsing Barbara Thompson's bid to run for the Kiwanis International Vice President in Salt Lake City in 2021. If elected she would serve in 2021-2022.
- 2. This resolution was to recognize the many Kiwanians that passed on in the last year. We lost 47 great people in the past year. Please keep them in your thoughts and prayers.






Reports were then given by our Foundations.

- 1. Barbara Thompson gave the Earl Collins Foundation report. She reported that it has been a tough year for fundraising. They were able to give 26 scholarships to high school seniors. They have also made a pledge to give \$25,000 each year in the next three years to Beatrice Johnson Kiwanis Youth Kamp.
- 2. Nancy Hoff gave a report on the Children's Fund. Kids need Kiwanis more than ever. As of June 30, 2020, MOARK district clubs and individuals had donated \$22,087 to the Children's Fund. Thanks to those clubs and individual Kiwanians who have donated. We appreciate your donations. For those of us who have not donated yet, remember they are due by the end of the Kiwanis year which is September 30th.
- 3. Roger Jespersen gave the Eliminate report. He stated that we have eliminated Neo-natal/Maternal Tetanus from all but 12 nations. He also reminded the group that matching funds were still available for Zellers through the district and encouraged clubs to take advantage of that. MOARK still has \$50,000 to donate for the pledge made to KI. rogerki16@gmail.com
- 4. Thom South gave a report from Beatrice Johnson Kiwanis Youth Kamp: The permanent rest room has been installed. Some grade leveling and concrete is still needed to complete the project which came in at the budgeted amount of \$45,000. Current unrestricted Kamp General Funds balance was \$48,400, this includes capital improvements. On July 31,2020 restricted funds balance was \$22,388, of which \$11,905 were for the Head Quarters Cabin. The Beatrice Johnson Kiwanis Youth Kamp is your Kamp. It belongs to the Missouri Arkansas Kiwanis. The Board wants you to be aware of and a part of what we do. Thank you for your support.
- 5. District Secretary, Mary Vaughan then gave the Secretaries Report by stating that:
 - Our plans to develop new clubs hit a snag when the Covid-19 Pandemic arrived. However, the Columbia County (Magnolia) Club has been our only club so far. We do have a few months left and plans to open at least five more clubs in the next 2 months.
 - We started the year with 180 clubs and 4,499 members. As of July 30, 2019, we have 176 clubs with 4,504 members. With the pandemic, it has been difficult to keep the membership on the positive side.
 - We also have a challenge to get and keep good, active Lt. Governors. Currently three divisions have no Lt. Governor while many current LTG's are serving their third or fourth terms. This is a huge concern. We need good leadership at the top of our divisions if we want our clubs to succeed.
 - Our SLP's have had some successes. Aktion Club has added three clubs and now has 12 clubs with a total of 217 members. That is three more clubs from last year. Builders Club is booming by chartering 17 new clubs this year for a total of 59 clubs. K Kids chartered 9 new clubs which brings them to 59 clubs. Thank goodness for our youth programs.

member of the Circle K while attending UCA in Conway, AR. "I love Kiwanis and am ready to serve and lead the MO-ARK Kiwanians as your Governor."



New Kiwanis International Leadership 2020-2021



Art Riley was elected president of Kiwanis International, Peter Mancuso was elected president-elect and Bert West was elected vice president during Kiwanis International Council, a special meeting of the board of trustees, past presidents, current district governors, the European Federation president and the Kiwanis Asia-Pacific chair. The Kiwanis International Board convened the Council on July 25, 2020, due to the cancellation of the 105th Kiwanis International Convention.

"The events of 2020 dictate that we look ahead with determination and optimism," said Art Riley, 2020-21 president. "The air of uncertainty caused by the COVID-19 virus demands we examine our values more than ever. In the coming year I will work to transform Kiwanis through membership growth, more focused youth leadership education and greater attention to diversity and inclusion."

Additionally, council voted to memorialize past international presidents who died in the past year, including: Ray Lansford, 1984-85; Frank DiNoto, 1986-87; Anton "Tony" Kaiser, 1987-88;

John Button, 2014-15; and Florencio "Poly" Lat, 2018-19.

Executive Director Stan Soderstrom addressed the challenges presented by the pandemic.

"Our inability to predict where we will be three months from now has never been more difficult," Soderstrom said. "We are not necessarily in crisis, nor are we in the midst of a calamity or impending disaster. We need to properly assess the environment in which we exist."

Soderstrom challenged members to be innovative when finding ways to meet, fundraise and support children in their communities. "We may not be able to predict the future, but we can begin to predict the skills we will need to survive and we can recognize that change is on the horizon," he said.

"It has been a difficult second half of the Kiwanis year," said 2019-20 Kiwanis International president Daniel Vigneron. "We have lost members to the pandemic and it has not been easy for our clubs to meet. Some of our initiatives have been put on hold, including training for expansion in Africa. I know that coming through this we will be stronger in the future. The transition of leadership to Art Riley and Peter Mancuso will put Kiwanis in a position to move our organization forward."


Union Kiwanis Youth Photo Contest

Springfield South Kiwanis Club Donates

On July 16, 2020, the Springfield South Kiwanis Club donated approximately 500 diapers to Kelly Papperella with the Diaper Bank of the Ozarks. The mission of the Diaper Bank of the Ozarks is to keep babies healthy and happy by distributing diapers to partner agencies serving families in need throughout the Ozarks. The Diaper Bank works with over 100 partner agencies, such as Crosslines and the Salvation Army, in Springfield and 58 counties throughout the Ozarks. Since the Diaper Bank opened in 2017, they have distributed nearly 5 million disposable diapers through their partner agencies in the Ozarks. In addition to distributing disposable diapers, the Diaper Bank of the Ozarks has a program to loan cloth diapers to families in need. Ms. Papperella said using cloth diapers will save a family an average of \$1,000 per year.

Thanks to the watchful eye of representatives for the Voluntary Action Center and the Columbia/Boone County Department of Health & Human Services, all preventative measures were in place to help protect against the spread of the coronavirus. As pictured, club members wore masks, gloves were worn while packing the lunches, and everyone practiced physical distancing throughout the event. On the following Thursday, June 18, Carol Clark, James Powell (pictured) and John Haralson (behind the camera) helped package and serve lunches to a larger number of children in Douglass Park. Everyone was shocked when the containers of food arrived, with a total of 64 meals. This far exceeded any previous day's head count. Thankfully, one of the summer school programs had called in, wanting a total of 45 meals, to be picked up by staff members. The remaining meals were given to a steady flow of hungry children visiting the park that day. To our surprise, all meals were distributed shortly after 12:00 and the operation closed down.


