# Mo-Ark Kiwanis—Community Service Award Program 2013-2014 Kiwanis Year

### The purpose of this award program is to:

- Provide recognition to clubs with outstanding community service activities.
- Serve as a platform to share ideas on projects among clubs and generate more enthusiasm and excitement about community service in Kiwanis.

#### **Definition:**

- Projects that will be considered for the Community Service Award Program should feature time given by members to a community activity conducted by the club in the 2013-2014 club year.
- This award program will not include fund raising activities.

#### Award timeline:

- Applications for the award must be submitted to John K. Hoffman, Community
  Service Recognition chair, by July 15, 2014.
  The winning clubs will be presented at the
  2014 District Convention in Springfield.
- Clubs selected will receive certificates of recognition.

#### Award criteria:

- Award applications will be evaluated on a variety of criteria including:
  - o Size and scope of project
  - o Community need met through the project
  - o Preference given to projects that assist youth

- o Number of hours given toward the project
- o Percentage of Kiwanians in the club who participated
- o Cooperation with other community members and sponsored leadership groups
- o Public relations value. Did you use this effort to tell the "Kiwanis story"?
- Each club may share up to three different projects in their nomination.
- Clubs are asked to provide electronically five photos of their project that can be used in the awards presentation and possibly in the *Kiwaniagram* or on the Mo-Ark website. We hope to use this program to help share ideas among clubs about successful service projects.
- While any project can be included in the nomination, we ask clubs to NOT duplicate the projects they are submitting for Young Children Priority One if possible. Clubs are encouraged to include Kiwanis One Day projects in their nomination.
